



Summer Service Learning in Rural China

Earn credits while addressing issues of poverty

What is the SSLP?

The SSLP is a poverty alleviation program where American and Chinese college students teach English to K-12 students in Chinese rural areas. Volunteers spend approximately 10-14 days at their respective sites and a few days in Beijing or Wuhan before and after their journey to the countryside. WSU students may receive up to three credits for their experience when combined with additional academic requirements.

When is it?

July 10-July 31, 2012

Who is eligible?

The program is open to Wayne State University students. Non-Wayne State university students may apply, but may not be eligible for stipends through Wayne State.

What is the cost?

Students may expect to pay about \$1500-1900 for airfare, \$750 for visa processing, in country expenses, travel health insurance plus tuition costs for three credits. Money is available to help pay for tuition costs and/or in-country expenses through the Confucius Institute. SSLP students are also encouraged to apply for Undergraduate Research Grants.

How do I apply?

To apply, first attend an information meeting at any of the times posted on the back of this announcement. Applications will be available on the Confucius Institute website.
